



MAIDENHEAD 2007 CENTENARY CAMP



25th - 28th May 2007

Maidenhead and District Scouts are organising a Special Camp for all the members of the Scout and Guide movement in Maidenhead, which we hope you will take part.

The object of the camp is to bring all members of the Scout and Guide Movement together to celebrate the Centenary of the founding of the Scout Movement in 1907, by Lord Baden-Powell.

During the camp there will be a full programme of activities and events designed for all age groups to participate. More details will appear in Future Newsletters.

Cubs, Scouts, Guides, Explorers, Rangers, Networks and Leaders from all Groups in Maidenhead, will camp for the weekend. Rainbows, Beavers and Brownies will be day visitors, either on the Saturday or Sunday of the camp.

Parents and youngsters please make a note of the date for the camp – Friday 25th May to Monday 28th May 2007 (Next Years Summer Term, half Term)

The cost of the camp for those camping will be £40, per youngster, which includes a tee shirt and a special camp badge. The cost to Rainbows, Beavers & Brownies will be £8, which also includes the special camp badge.

We will be camping at Marsh Meadow in Cookham. The Site is between Cookham Moor and the River Thames. Thank you goes to Mr Geoff Copas for allowing us to camp on his land.





The rest of the Camp Team are:

Ray Tucker (DC) will be camp leader and will have ultimate responsibility for all those on site. There will be no alcohol allowed on site. The youngsters (Under 18 year olds) will not be allowed to bring any battery-operated items, except for a small torch and a watch.



Shirley Hammond (GSL 21st Maidenhead) has prepared a menu and this will be issued with the next newsletter. All the food for the weekend will be provided by Shirley and will be issued to the sub camps at the appropriate times. Nearer to the camp there will be a form to fill in and part of this will allow campers to let their camp leaders know if they have any special dietary needs. This information will then be passed on to Shirley to ensure everybody will be catered for.

Alan Hoskins (DSL) will look after camp security; we will employ a professional security company, at night, to ensure the safety of all the campers.

Clive Hammond (ESL Cox Green) and **Tony Doolan** will be looking after services which include the provision of water to the site, Ray is also looking into this. We will again have professional toilets on site. Sub camps will liaise with Clive to obtain equipment that they require and do not have. Clive will be responsible for providing power for the fridges in the catering section whether it is by generator or mains power from adjacent premises.





Bill Carter (ADC Activities) & **Nicolette Smith** (ESL Young Leaders) are looking after the activities which will be available on site. They have the complete list of the activities, which were undertaken, at Millennium camp (The last District Camp organised by Maidenhead Scouts) and they are expecting to be able to increase these. They have put together a small team to represent all the sections in the Scout and Guide sections, one person will represent each section, if you have any ideas please make contact. It is hoped that the next newsletter will include details of the activities on offer.

Bob Parker (District Treasurer) will handle all the money for the camp. All cheques will need to be payable to **Maidenhead 2007**. The bank account for all cheques passed to Bob will be to **Maidenhead 2007** all other cheques will be returned. The cost of the camp will be £40, Sub camp leaders are responsible for collecting the money and passing it on to Bob. The Rainbows, Beavers, Brownies as day visitors will be charged £8. Everybody attending the camp will have an embroidered badge, as the one at the heading of this Newsletter. This badge may be worn on the uniform for one year. This badge was designed by Rachael Aldridge of Furze Platt Scout Group.

Dave Chesterman (District Executive Chairman) will be the Chairman Organising and will be having short meetings with all concerned to ensure that everything is going to plan.
